2. Mālama 'Āina 🎉

Protect the land: no littering, no off-roading and respect "Kapu" signs (kapu mean forbidden).

3. Driving Etiquette

- Relaxed pace, no tailgating
- Honking = emergencies only
- · Yield to pedestrians
- · Let people merge

4. Cultural Awareness 🗥

- Show reverence at sacred sites, and practice respect and patience throughout your visit
- Practice pronouncing Hawaiian place names like Kāhala, Waiʻalae and Makapuʻu - your effort shows respect and locals truly appreciate it

5. Ocean & Nature Safety 🎾

- Check the surf and signage before swimming
- Never turn your back on the ocean
- Do not touch sacred hawaiian wildlife (turtles and monk seals)

- Mahalo = Thank you
- 'Ohana = Family
- · 'Āina = Land
- Mālama = Respect
- Pono = Balance/Righteousness
